RULES & REGULATIONS:

1. **Eligibility:** Entry is open to currently enrolled 4-H and FFA members 8 years old through 12th grade, from Jackson, Gadsden, Calhoun, Liberty, Bay, Washington, Walton, Holmes, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Escambia, Franklin, Jefferson, Leon, Wakulla, Gulf Counties in Florida; Geneva and Houston Counties in Alabama; Seminole County in Georgia.
2. **Age:** All exhibitors must be presently enrolled in school. All participants must be at least eight years old by September 1, 2020 and not have graduated High School.
3. **Entry forms and fees:** There will be a \$10 entry fee for each animal exhibited. An Entry Form must be correctly filled in and is not considered complete unless accompanied by the Entry Fee. Entry forms and fees must be received in the Jackson County Extension Office by ***September 11, 2020***. Late registration and fees will be accepted until September 25, 2020 with a \$10 late fee. **No entries will be accepted after 9/25/2020.** All entry forms must be printed legibly, filled out completely, and signed by the member, parent and FFA advisor or 4-H Agent.
4. Exhibitors will be responsible for the care, feeding and watering of their animals for the entire time they are on the show grounds. All animals must have access to feed and water for the duration of the exhibition at the Expo. Failure to comply with these rules will result in forfeiture of all prizes and awards.
5. All goats must possess milk teeth to be eligible to show in the meat goat show.
6. **All Goats must have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection within 30 days of the show date and a Scrapie premise number.**

7. Goats that originated in the state of Florida no longer need to be tested for tuberculosis or brucellosis within thirty days of the show. Goats originating from out of state must have been tested for tuberculosis and brucellosis within 30 days of the show.
8. Youth are not limited to the number of animals they can bring. However, the animal must be shown by the exhibitor unless there are two animals in the same class. In the event of an exhibitor having more than one animal in the same class, that exhibitor must notify the show Chairperson of whom the “assisting” showman will be. Assisting showman must be a bona-fide 4-H or FFA member. This shall only apply in the event of an exhibitor requiring the assistance of an extra showman during the goat shows.
9. All pens and areas in front of pens must be kept clean and swept at all times.
10. All pens will have 4-H or FFA Exhibitor stall cards.
11. Entries will be placed by the judge, with placings provided to the top 5 goats in each class.
12. Injured or diseased animals, as determined by the PYE Board, will not be allowed to unload at the Ag Center and will be ineligible for participation in the Show.
13. All goats are released and can be removed from the premises immediately following Showmanship on Friday, October 16, 2020.
14. Any grievances must be submitted in writing to the Show Chair, and must be accompanied by a \$100 fee.
15. Mandatory exhibitor meeting following final check in, to go over rules and expectations.

DRESS CODE: Exhibitors entering the show ring shall be dressed appropriately with respect to the organization they represent.

- a. FFA members- Dark pants/jeans, closed toe shoes/boots, shirt with a collar. FFA Jacket and FFA tie are optional.
- b. 4-H members - Dark pants/jeans, closed toe shoes/boots, shirt with a collar.

SHOWMANSHIP:

- **Junior Showmanship** – FFA and 4-H members age 8 -10 years of age as of 9/1/2020.
- **Intermediate Showmanship** – FFA and 4-H members age 11-13 years of age as of 9/1/2020.
- **Senior Showmanship** – FFA and 4-H members ages 14-18 years of age as of 9/1/2020.

If there are more than 6 entries in an age division, classes may be divided into multiple heats within the Age group, trying to limit the classes to no more than 6 exhibitors per heat. Based on the number of participants, the judge will determine the participants from each heat who will then compete for best age division Showman.

CATEGORIES: Competition is for Market Meat Goats and Breeding Does. All Breeds and Cross-breeds of goats are eligible for competition. ***Bucks are not permitted in the show.**
