**BASE DATE OF SHOW: January 2, 2021**

**NOTICE:** The Senior Doe & the Junior Doe shows are sanctioned separately.

There will be no premiums or prize monies awarded for any show. ADGA rosettes will be awarded for Grand Champion, Reserve Grand Champion, Best of Breed, and Best in Show.

### RULES AND REGULATIONS

*The AMERICAN DAIRY GOAT ASSOCIATION (ADGA) rules shall govern.*

**1. ENTRY FEES:** Entry fees for either the Senior Doe or Junior Doe show

**Submitted on or before December 22, 2020**

**\$10 per ring OR 3-rings for \$25**

**2. LATE ENTRIES**

**Submitted December 23, 2020 - January 1, 2021 \$12 per ring**

**PLEASE NOTE: ENTRY FEES MUST ACCOMPANY ENTRIES.** For entries to be considered “on-time”, payment must be Submitted on or before December 19, 2020. Entries not submitted by December 19, 2020 or payments received after December 19, 2020 will be considered late and late entry fee will apply. Entry fees are non-refundable.

There will be NO REFUNDS of entry fees if an exhibitor chooses to leave the show early. NO EXCEPTIONS. The show committee reserves the right to waive entry fees and/or late fees at their discretion.

#### **ARRIVAL AND VET CHECK:**

**Early arrival** will begin Friday, January 1, 2021 from 6:00 PM until 8:00 PM. Please notify Karen Walden, [3ringnewyear@gmail.com](mailto:3ringnewyear@gmail.com), if you plan on arriving Friday. **The State Vet will be on-site from 6:00 PM – 8:00 PM.**

**Regular arrival:** Saturday, January 2, 2021 will be from 6:00 AM - 7:30 AM. **The State Vet will be on-site from 6:00 AM - 7:30 AM.**

An accredited state veterinarian will be checking animals **BEFORE** they are **UNLOADED** and allowed into the barn/show arena between the vet hours listed above. If you are renting pens on-site, you may set up your pens prior to the vet check but your animals must be vet checked before being off-loaded into the pens. If you are setting up pens in the parking area, you must get vet checked before unloading your animals.

#### **REGISTRATION CHECK IN:**

Check-in schedule for registration of animals is as follows:

Friday, January 1, 2020: 6:00 PM to 8:30 PM

**Saturday, January 2, 2020: 6:30 AM to 8:00 AM**

**IT IS THE EXHIBITOR’S RESPONSIBILITY TO MAKE SURE HIS/HER ANIMALS ARE CHECKED IN BEFORE THE BOOKS CLOSE AT THE TIMES LISTED ABOVE. NO CHANGES WILL BE MADE AFTER THAT TIME.**

#### **PENS:**

**There are 140 4x4 pens available reserve early if you need pens.** You may lease a pen for \$5.00 for the weekend (Friday night thru Sunday end of show). Pens do not need to be cleaned before you depart but we ask that all garbage be placed in the garbage cans. **Shaving will be available for purchase at the show for \$5 but must be pre ordered**

This is still considered a tailgate show and you may set up your own pens. If owner sets up his/her pens all bedding, all hay and debris **MUST** be removed and placed in the proper receptacle prior to departure. You **MUST** check out with a member of the show committee before leaving the grounds.

### **SHOW ATTIRE:**

White or black pants/capris/skirts and plain, white-collared shirts are mandatory for the open senior and junior doe shows. 4-H and FFA attire is also acceptable for the youth showmanship and the open doe shows. Herd/club logos and pin-stripping on collar/sleeve is acceptable. No short shorts, tank tops, leggings, or yoga pants are allowed as show attire. Closed toed shoes or boots are required, and hats or caps are not allowed in the show ring. In the event of inclement weather, jackets and/or coats will be allowed. Exhibitors not conforming to the dress code will not be allowed to enter the ring.

### **JUDGING:**

**Judging will begin at 9:00 AM on Saturday, January 2, 2021 starting with Youth Showmanship, followed by the Senior Doe Show, and concluding with the Junior Doe Show.**

The judges and their secretaries will begin in the rings listed below and move to the next ring upon completion of judging of the breeds assigned to each ring. Animals for each breed assigned to a ring should remain at ring side as the judges and secretaries move from one ring to the next.

### **RINGS**

The breeds listed below will show in one ring for all shows; judges and secretaries will move. The Senior and Junior doe shows are separately sanctioned.

The breeds sanctioned for Senior Doe Shows are: **L**= LaMancha, **N**=Nubian, **ND**=Nigerian Dwarf,

**A**=Alpine, **RG**=Recorded Grade, and **AOP**=All Other Purebreds (Oberhasli, Saanen, Toggenburg, and Sable)

The breeds sanctioned for Junior Doe Shows are: **L**= LaMancha, **N**=Nubian, **ND**=Nigerian Dwarf,

, **A**= Alpine, **RG**=Recorded Grade, and **AOP**=All Other Purebreds (Oberhasli, Saanen, Toggenburg, and Sable)

The order of the show is subject to change. The show committee reserves the right to change the order in which the breeds are judged to keep the show moving in a timely manner. Exhibitors with more than one breed need to be prepared to have additional handlers.

### **SHOWMANSHIP - Belt Buckles will be awarded**

Showmanship will begin on January 2, 2021 at 9:00 am sharp. There will be three divisions:

Junior: ages 10 and under

Intermediate: ages 11 to 13

Senior: ages 14 to 18

Age group is determined by the base date of the show (January 2, 2021). The show committee reserves the right to change the age breaks depending on the number of entries per divisions. Please use entry form and list the child's name, age, division. The animal must be registered in the open show to be used in showmanship.

### **HEALTH RULES:**

All goats must have a certificate of veterinary inspection and a scrapie premise number. A health certificate current within 90 days for goats originating in the State of Florida or 30 days for goats originating from out of state. Goats originating in the State of Florida no longer require testing for tuberculosis or brucellosis. Goats originating from out of state must have been tested for tuberculosis and brucellosis within 90 days of the show.

### **LIABILITY FOR LOSS OR THEFT**

The owner or custodian of property of any kind brought to the Fairgrounds; either for exhibit or for other purposes, assumes as a condition of its admission to the grounds, all risk and/or responsibility for its loss, damage or theft.

Ring in the new Year, its officers, members and volunteers cannot and will not accept responsibility and liability for any damage or injury resulting from theft, fire, the elements, accidents, or other conditions or causes; whether to exhibits, property of exhibitor, vehicles on the grounds and articles left therein or any other property of any nature whatsoever.

### **GENERAL:**

The American Dairy Goat Association registration certificate is required on all animals 6 months of age or older. A duplicate application for registry stamped by the ADGA office is permissible for animals under 6 months of age. The original registration (no Copies) or stamped duplicate application must be available to the show secretary at the time of arrival.

***Please make sure your animals are correctly tattooed. Failure to do so makes your dairy goat ineligible to receive credit for their win.***

All dairy goats must be dehorned, disbudded, or naturally polled. The show chairperson will designate where to dump milk at check-in.

No awards will be given to any animal in any class, if in the opinion of the judge said animal does not meet breed standards.

Over-uddering of dairy goats is frowned upon. The judge shall have the authority to excuse animals from the ring for removal of excess milk

It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to properly feed, water, milk, and care for their animals. Failure to do so will result in exhibitor's immediate expulsion from the premises.

We will use every precaution in our power to protect the animals, but we will not be held responsible for injury, fire, theft, or death.

The Show Committee shall have the authority to expel any exhibitor or any in their company for failure to abide by these rules contained herein, or for unacceptable conduct. The exhibitor and/or any in their company will also be prohibited from showing at this venue the following year. By application for admission, each exhibitor and any in their company agree that they have read, understood, and will abide by these rules.

PLEASE NOTE: Dogs are not allowed at the show!

### **Camping:**

Dry or self contained camping will be allowed Friday - Sunday am. There are no hook ups for water or electric. There is a dump station available.

#### RELEASE:

Please leave the grounds as you found them. All bedding and trash must be removed and put into designated containers before you may leave the grounds.

Dairy goats and exhibitors will be released following the last class in which you are showing, **unless you must remain for Best in Show.** All Best of Breeds for the Senior/Junior Doe Shows must remain for Best in Show.

PLEASE NOTE: If your doe was Grand Champion and there was not a Champion Challenger, then she/he is automatically Best of Breed and must remain for Best in Show.

All exhibitors MUST check out with a member of the show committee before leaving the grounds.

#### **COVID 19:**

The state of Florida and county of Hillsborough recommend appropriate social distancing such as wearing mask, staying 6 feet apart, and proper hand sanitation. Masks are not required but are encouraged. Judges will wear mask when appropriate at their discretion and will have hand washing stations for their use. Exhibitors are asked to use appropriate social distancing and wash hands frequently. Due to the ever-changing rules for COVID 19, these rules may change at any time. If you are an "at risk" person or are showing any signs of sickness, please do not attend. By application for admission, each exhibitor and anyone in their company agree that they have read, understand, and abide by these rules in their entirety.
